

## Keeler Obenshain Moves Offices

Keeler Obenshain has moved its Harrisonburg office to 90 N. Main St., just one block north of its former location at 111 E. Market St.

The move follows a renovation of a downtown building located at the corner of Main and Elizabeth Streets, a process that started in the spring of 2004. Designed by architects John Mather and George Schmidheiser and constructed by Nielsen Construction, the renovation saw the complete gutting and build-out of the early 1900s building.

The building's architectural features include an abundance of new windows, resurfacing of the building's exterior, and reorientation of the building's entrance to center points on the north and south sides. Inside, a glass and pillared pass-through atrium provides spacious stair and elevator access to the upstairs suite of Keeler Obenshain offices.

Deb Mitchell of Interiors by Reflection, the interior decorator for the project, used clean-lined furnishings, natural wood flooring and a palate of serene colors, combining aesthetics and function for Keeler Obenshain's 22 attorneys, paralegals and staff.

Keeler Obenshain will have several designated client parking spaces in the parking lot between the 90 North Main building and WHSV-TV3.
