Keeler Obenshain Adding Two Partners

Keeler Obenshain PC has opened its third office, in the Innsbrook Corporate Center in Richmond.

The law firm, founded in 2002 by Steven Keeler and Mark Obenshain, also added two partners. Thomas Bowden Sr. and Patrick Asplin, both named to Virginia Business magazine's Legal Elite in December, will work in the firm's emerging company and venture capital practice group.
